- **2.** <u>Rising Action:</u> In the rising action, a series of events build toward the point of greatest interest.
- 3. **Falling Action:** Falling action is made up of the events after the climax (most intense part of the story) of a story that wraps up the plot and leads to resolution (end).
- 4. **Theme:** the subject of the novel or piece of literature
- 5. **Static character:** is one that does not undergo important change in the course of the story, remaining essentially the same at the end as he or she was at the beginning.
- 6. **Dynamic character:** one that does undergo an important change in the course of the story.
